Anonymous Backpack Donation



A message to Staff, Volunteers, Donors, and Advocates By Executive Director, Cathie Lancaster



As we slip into fall, football and soccer season are upon us and many families are spending their Saturdays rooting their children on as they run up and down the playing fields. Sadly, this is not true for many of the youth in foster care. They do not usually have the opportunity to play extracurricular sports and if they do, family is often not able to be there to support them. However, if a child has a Court Appointed Special Advocate they have a special person in their corner to be their cheering section, to be there for special events and make sure they are successful in school.

It is hard for me to believe that just over 5 years ago I started my journey with CASA. After being in the For Profit sector for almost 38 years, it was a huge change to enter into the Non Profit world. I found myself counting paper clips, watching

the number of paper copies that we printed and standing guard over the thermostat to ensure we stayed within our limited budget. I was one of those people that would see a commercial on TV about donating new PJs or school supplies for foster youth and I wondered why. I would think, "They are living with a family that should be taking care of them why do they need those items?" I did not understand what a foster youth experiences each day and how scary life without parents, siblings and extended family can be. I had not imagined what it would be like to be removed from your home in the middle of the night only to be placed with strangers, not having your favorite toy or pair of sneakers with you, and having your daily routine disrupted. Now I see all of this on a daily basis and it is heart wrenching. All children have a right to a home with loving people to care for them. However, each year, hundreds of children in Merced County are abandoned, abused and neglected by their families. This is where CASA comes in!

CASA opened our doors twelve years ago and since that time, we have trained over 475 volunteers and served over 450 children. There are currently almost 800 children in foster care in Merced County and many of them are waiting for a caring, consistent, loving person – a CASA – to enter into their life. Could this be you?

Farewell Charissa Beardsley—Welcome Daisy Trujillo


