### A message from our Executive Director, Cathie Lancaster

Friends of CASA,

2020 promised to be an exciting year for CASA of Merced County. We were looking forward to celebrating our TENTH anniversary of serving foster children in Merced County, planning two in person fundraising events, taking our CASA youth on fun summer adventures and training new Advocates. In what seemed like an instant, our work schedules, our social lives, so many of the patterns and rituals that make up our daily lives changed. We were thrown into a crisis, and we felt scared—for ourselves and for our loved ones. Everything changed. We had to quickly become a remote work force to comply with state and CDC guidelines. We knew we could make it work and we have. We are still here every day to support our volunteers who are on the front lines of social work, making sure our kids are safe.

The children we serve, all victims of abuse and neglect, experience a similar sense of fear with the chaos of sudden change. Sadly, the stress is often woven into the fabric of their young lives, creating patterns that may define their future, their story. Imagine if you can how you would feel if, in the middle of this pandemic, you were told that you could not live with the person you love, that your new home would be with strangers in a different city, and maybe your siblings would be in a different home in a different town.

This is the crisis our children deal with every day, often for years, before a sense of calm is finally restored. This is their reality, and this fear has affected more than 600 children in Merced County!

Even COVID-19 cannot stop our mission to assure a safe, nurturing home for all abandoned, abused and/ or neglected foster youth by providing a highly trained volunteer to advocate for them in the court system. Our volunteers have continued with their regular visits, even though they look a little bit different right now. Volunteers have learned how to use Zoom, FaceTime or Skype to communicate with their kiddos as well as calling and texting. They have learned to play games and do craft projects over the phone. Some are even having "socially-distant" conversations from across the lawn. Through the entire crisis, CASA volunteers have had their eyes on the kids.

While I cannot say that I am surprised by the unwavering dedication our volunteers have to the children they serve, I will say that I am so thankful we have a committed group of over 100 volunteers who have been fiercely advocating for children throughout this pandemic. I am so grateful for their steadfast commitment.

Thanks to you our wonderful supporters, most of these children do not have to face this crisis alone. CASA of Merced County has advocated for over 100 children in 2020. We hope we can count on you to continue your support of CASA this year, just as we count on CASA volunteers to continue their advocacy. Even the COVID–19 pandemic cannot stop our volunteers from making sure their CASA children are cared for in a safe environment, and have what they need to thrive.

In this time of uncertainty, there is hope - that together we can do extraordinary things. We know we are in this together, with our neighbors, family, friends, co-workers and that brings some comfort. It is a crisis, but we will get through it together.

During a time when so much is unknown, I realize you must have plenty on your mind. It is not easy to ask you to also think of the hundreds of children we serve every year. However, I am asking, for them, for every child we are serving today, and for the children on our waiting list. Each of them has a story, and we want them to be safe through their crises. She also advises new volunteers to be themselves; try to make your new relationship with the child as comfortable for them as possible. The children will open up to you in their own time.
