A message to Staff, Volunteers, Donors, and Advocates **By Executive Director, Cathie Lancaster**



In America, the concept of government-run child welfare and foster care go back about 100 years, to the creation of the national Children's Bureau in 1912. The preference of foster care over the formerly common "orphanages" for abused, abandoned, or neglected children has been increasing in public attention for decades. In 1977, a Seattle Washington Judge, David Soukup, created the concept of Court Appointed Special Advocates. In 1985, President Ronald Reagan presented the National CASA Association with the Presidents Volunteer Action Award. 1988 President Reagan issued the first presidential proclamation that established May as National Foster Care Month. In 1997, the National Bar Association endorsed CASA volunteer advocacy. In 2010, CASA of Merced County was founded.

In 2020, CASA of Merced County should have celebrated 10 years advocating for children in foster care with a party, instead with the rest of the world we were sheltering in place. However, the true celebration was that we were able to keep our doors open and continue to advocate for the children in foster care.

Children may enter into foster care from birth through their twentyfirst birthday. Many have been abused, abandoned and neglected and are angry, confused, and without hope. Most struggle trusting anyone; the people that should love and protect them have failed to do so.

On any given day in the United States, there are more than 400,000 children living in foster care. Over the course of a year, nearly 700,000 children spend at least some time in foster care. In California, 83,000 children live in our foster care system – the largest such population in our nation. In Merced County, we have close to 800 children in care. If we took all the children in foster care and placed them in one city, that location would be the twenty-first largest city in the United States! That is staggering. These children and youth are part of our future, and we cannot abandon them

Nationally, 60 million hours have been spent by CASA's since 2010. In Merced, we have spent 49,197 hours advocating for our kiddos since we opened our doors in 2010. Advocates in Merced County have driven 472,226 miles with their kiddos or doing things for them since 2010 – that is almost 19 trips around the world! In my opinion this is pretty impressive.

Every day, I am inspired by the commitment and passion of our Advocates. I believe that Court Appointed Special Advocate volunteers, or "CASAs," are one of the most effective ways to ensure that a child in the dependency court system is heard, that their best interests are met, and that they find stability and permanency in their lives.

I would like to give a heartfelt thanks to the fantastic CASA volunteers who give so much of themselves to provide these children inspiration and love. With your help, CASAs are changing lives, every single day.

Thank you for your concern and compassion for all the children in foster care in Merced County.

She spent time with many youths, all with different personalities and a variety of life experiences and living situations. This has helped her be able to see young people as individuals with their own unique learning styles, ways of managing their emotions, and what they view as rewards.

Lynn believes CASA is an important aspect in the lives of foster children because it provides them with a consistent, supportive adult in their lives. For some, it's the first opportunity to develop a healthy, positive relationship with another person. Many things can and will change in the lives of foster children, but a CASA will always be there-- just for them. Lynn's advice to a new CASA visiting their kiddo would be, "bring a smile on their face, an open heart and mind, and a listening ear". More general advice she would give to a new CASA volunteer is, "I think foster children need to know that you are happy to spend time with them, you value what they feel and say, and that you will still be with them no matter what may happen in their lives. Your CASA kiddo will help teach you how to be the best advocate for him or her."
