### A Message from the Board President: Serving the Uncared

In Merced County, at any moment, over 400 children and youth are in foster care. Some have experienced immeasurable neglect and know what it is like to go to bed feeling unloved and alone. Perhaps Mother Teresa said it best:

"Being unwanted, unloved, uncared for, forgotten by everybody, I think that is a much greater hunger, a much greater poverty than the person who has nothing to eat." Mother Theresa

The very purpose of CASA of Merced County (Court Appointed Special Advocates) is to provide support, mentoring, and a sense of belonging and worth to those youth in our neighborhoods that are in the foster children network. So many of these children have been abused, abandoned, or neglected and they have been removed from those households and parents for their own protection.

Through a network of volunteers – caring, giving adults just like you – that we call advocates, these children are connected with community members who volunteer their talents and heart-felt support to show foster youth that they are not alone, that they are cared for, and that someone is there to help them navigate the road ahead.

Being a volunteer will be one of the most rewarding experiences of your life. Here is how Gandhi put it:

"The best way to find yourself is to lose yourself in the service of others." Mahatma Gandhi

Today, CASA of Merced County has community members, from stay-at-home parents to corporate executives to caring neighbors from every walk of life, who feel that immeasurable sense of purpose and satisfaction because they are advocates for the rights and futures of these once-neglected, unwanted children and youth.

If you are not yet an advocate, let me ask you to lose yourself in the service of others. We will provide you with all of the orientation and training and support that you require and any amount of time you have, however minimal or extensive, will be useful and will make a difference in the lives of the youth you will serve.

Beyond serving as an advocate, there are so many other ways to be a "difference maker" for CASA. From hosting a field trip to serving as a role model/speaker to assisting with our annual fundraising events, you are needed and wanted. Just contact the capable administrative staff or any of the advocates and volunteers of CASA and we will immediately get you connected.
